

## RFQ – Engineering Design for Community Kiosks

The Washington State Parks (WSP) and its standing committee, Coulee Corridor Consortium 2005 Grant Committee is soliciting Statements of Qualifications from qualified consulting firms with expertise in the preparation of plans, specifications and services during construction. The CCC will select a consultant for the following federally funded National Scenic Byways Program project:

**SB-WA -2005-5219 Byway Facilities & Interpretive Improvements:** The major feature of the project, all for the promotion of the Coulee Corridor Byway are as follows:

Engineering plans, specifications and estimate for the development of community kiosks, located at Byway communities that provide information for the Byway and the community.

Each community kiosk will include four (4) 24”x 36” high pressure laminate panels and kiosks will be located in seven communities along the Scenic Byway. Engineer will not be responsible for panel content.

The selected firm will need to integrate volunteer efforts with their services as appropriate.

WSP and CCC reserve the right to retain the services of the successful consultant for any and all subsequent phases for the above referenced project.

Submittals should include the following information: firm name, contact information, name of principal-in-charge and project manager, and number of employees in the firm that will be dedicated to the project.

Submittals will be evaluated and ranked based on the following criteria: 1) Proximity to the Coulee Corridor byway region (25%), 2) Firm experience with WSDOT and FHWA programs including familiarity with WSDOT Local Agency guidelines (25%), 3) Familiarity with various rules and design criteria for Washington State Highways and the Coulee Corridor Scenic Byway from Othello, HWY 17 to Omak, HWY 155, as outlined in the Coulee Corridor Interpretive Master Plan Design Guidelines (15%), 4) Past performance/references in designing and installing roadway features (15%), 5) Diversity of experience of key personnel and relevance of such experience to the region (10%) and 6) Firm experience with design and development of the Corridor Management Plan (10%). WSP and CCC encourages disadvantaged, minority, and women-owned consultant firms to respond.
